My Dear Sister

I have not paper from Melbourne however as a signal that I arrived all right. I would have wrote earlier but I could not hear any thing of Eddy Bugas. I have been a month in Sydney. I have heard of Peter and Downs and of the Aspinas, they are broke and that was the reason they did not write to me I expect so.

I cannot go to New Guinea. No ship that are going there. So I have made up my mind today to go to a different place etc. There's one to be said that it is a healthy climate.

How I will get along there I don't know but I am going to have a look at it. Gold will be always be able to tell where I am because I will always send papers. I am very glad that I slanted, the only thing that I am sorry for that I did not take your advice before. I have got no more to say at present. Give my best respect to everybody.
